ABOUT THE PRESUMPTIVE CANCER LEGISLATION CAMPAIGN

What is Presumptive Cancer Legislation?

Presumptive legislation simplifies the process for firefighters to claim workers compensation if they are diagnosed with a primary cancer that listed under the legislation.

This means when a firefighter needs to provide proof to claim compensation, it will be presumed that they have developed cancer because of firefighting work.

This legislation passed parliament 22 November 2018. Cancers that are currently covered are:

- Primary site brain cancer
- · Primary leukaemia
- Primary site breast cancer
- Primary site testicular cancer
- Primary site bladder cancer
- Primary site kidney cancer

- Primary non-Hodgkin lymphoma
- Multiple myeloma
- Primary site prostate cancer
- Primary site ureter cancer
- Primary site colorectal cancer
- · Primary site oesophageal cancer

Without this important piece of legislation, firefighters would be expected to pay thousands of dollars out-of-pocket for cancer treatment costs. **An average cost of a claim is \$171,791**, but some claims are over \$400,00.

What are we fighting for?

Though current NSW presumptive cancer laws provide compensation for some cancers, firefighters are left uncovered for a range of cancers.

Firefighters in both other states and internationally have cover for a wider range of cancers - its time NSW presumptive cancer laws do the same.
